

A theatre project for the UN Climate Conference on migration, the environment and climate change.

Not only war, violence and poverty force people into flight and migration. In 2015 alone, 20 million people were forced to leave their homes due to heatwaves, droughts, storms and floods.

How might people fleeing from climate change be safeguarded? What happens to people who no longer have a home, and who have lost their livelihoods? And what level of responsibility do the states of the Global North bear?

STAY uses theatre to playfully explore causes and consequences of climate-induced migration.

The project is developed by artist Sonja Hornung and theatre-maker Richard Pettifer as a commission from the Federal Environmental Agency (Umweltbundesamt).

STAY will be shown in co-operation with the **Bonn Institute for Migration Research e.V.** (Bonner Institut für Migrationsforschung) on the occasion of the **UN Climate Conference** in Bonn.

For the project's realisation, we are looking for:

- Refugees and migrants who, together with the two artists and a theatre pedagogue, would like to develop a theatre performance about migration, the environment and climate change.

Prerequisites:

- enjoyment of creative working processes (no previous experience necessary)
- basic German (from level B1) and/or English are preferable;
- participation in 6 rehearsals in Oct. 2017 and 3 rehearsals in Nov. at the Bonn Institute for Migration Research e.V., as well as in the performance in Nov. 2017.

Participants will receive a small monetary compensation.
